They looked up and saw a star shining in the east, beyond them far; and to the earth it gave great light, and so it continued both day and night: Nowell, born is the King of Israel.


And by the light of that same star, three Wise Men came from country far; to seek for a king was their intent, and to follow the star wheresoever it went: Nowell, born is the King of Israel.
