

Pilgrimage Santiago de Compostela

As you may know, the first part of Fr. Alan's sabbatical has been spent on pilgrimage to Santiago de Compostela in Galicia, Spain.

There are many pilgrimage routes to Santiago de Compostela; they vary in length and can be traveled on foot, by bicycle, and even on horseback. The *Camino de Santiago* (Way of St. James) is used to refer to any of the pilgrimage routes to the shrine of the apostle St. James who is believed to be buried in the Cathedral at Santiago de Compostela.

The route Fr. Alan is traveling, *Camino Francés*, is more than 800 kilometers long. We hope you continue to keep Fr. Alan in your thoughts and prayers as he completes this pilgrimage. Included below is some information about the *Camino Francés*.



"The Camino Francés, the most popular route of the Way of St. James, starts at the French village Saint-Jean-Pied-de-Port close to the Spanish border. The way crosses the Pyrenees to Roncesvalles. Then it goes through four Spanish autonomous regions: Navarra, La Rioja, Castilla y León and Galicia. The major cities of Pamplona, Logroño, Burgos and León are passed until the destination of Santiago de Compostela is reached. There, according to legend, the remains of St. James, one of the Twelve Apostles of Jesus, are held." (Map and text from www.camino-frances.com)

Education for Ministry

New Fall Term Starts in September

Education for Ministry (EfM) was developed by the School of Theology at the University of the South at Sewanee, Tennessee, in 1975. In the four-year program, a group of six to twelve participants study the Bible and supplied texts. In addition, participants use EfM's process of theological reflection to incorporate the readings into our hearts and lives. Through weekly study and discussion, participants form a closely knit community. Some people say the letters EfM mean "Exploring Faith Matters," because in our EfM meetings, we explore what our Biblical and church traditions mean to us, the better to help us discover and develop the particular ministries to which we are called in our baptismal vows. Often EfM helps us continue work we are already doing, by seeing it more intentionally as a ministry.

During the 2014-2015 EfM year, highlights included several guest speakers. Father Alan gave us an introductory journey through Ecclesiastes, Annemarie Kidder spoke to us on the Christian responses to the rise of Nazism, and Reverend Sally Webster spoke to us on prayer. We are especially grateful to our guest speakers for enriching our seminar.

Mentors Rachel Diem (rachelnew1@yahoo.com) and Mandy Davis (madavi@umich.edu) will be signing up new members in August and September. Although participants are asked to commit to attend faithfully, read the supplied texts, and contribute in discussion, no exams or term papers are required. When Should I Call a Priest?

All too often the church's clergy and staff only find out about births, deaths, and other important events long after they have already occurred. St. Andrew's has six clergy persons, all of whom would love to meet with you and/or your family to provide guidance, blessings, or a shoulder to lean on.

Call the Clergy . . .

- **When someone in your family is nearing death or dies.** Allow us to be available to you not just in planning a memorial service but to provide spiritual guidance during an extremely difficult time.

- **When someone in your family is seriously ill.** Clergy are more than happy to visit you and your loved ones in the hospital or at home. Did you know that you can have communion brought to you in the hospital or at your home if you are ill or housebound?

- **When someone in your family is going to have surgery.** If you let us know ahead of time, a clergy person can arrange to visit before, during, and/or after the surgery, throughout the recovery process, and lead you in healing prayers.

- **When you or someone in your family is having a crisis of faith or simply seeking answers.** Make an appointment to talk to one of our clergy! They are here to help you in all aspects of your faith and will do our best to answer the tough questions you may have.

- **When you or someone in your family loses a job, suffers a difficult personal loss, or is struggling with a mental health issue.** Please contact our clergy so that they may help guide you and your loved ones through this difficult period and provide you with additional resources that you may not know about.

- **When a child is born, share your joy with us!** Don't wait until it is time to be baptized (or directory updates) to notify us of new additions to the family. Our clergy are always glad to hear happy news and would love to greet your child.

- **When something wonderful is happening in your life.** Allow us to present not just for the difficulties you face but also for the happiness and joy.
