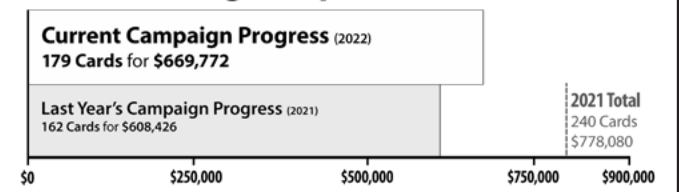


## 2022 ANNUAL GIVING CAMPAIGN

## MUSIC NOTES

**Hymn 286: *Who are these like stars appearing*** There are many great hymns to celebrate All Saints Day; this is one of them. The text of this hymn, a dialog based on Revelation 7:9-17, places us alongside St. John as he witnesses the worship of the multitudes in heaven. In that vision, one of the heavenly elders asks John the question at the beginning of our hymn ("who are these...?"), answering it himself when John cannot. The text and tune both originated in 16th-century Germany; Frances Cox translated the text in the early 19th; we sing five verses of her 14-verse translation. -- Donna Wessel Walker
