While the Covid-19 pandemic continues to be a factor in how we communicate, educate, worship, and maintain community, it is with great joy that we resume gathering each week for in-person worship, formation, and ministry.


Over the next few weeks we will be shining a light on ministries and parish life at St. Andrew's and asking for your financial support during these trying times.


During this time we are asking you to prayerfully consider:


- What brought you to St. Andrew's?
- What does our church family and ministry mean in your life?
- How can you respond, as generously as you are able, to help maintain our church home and ministries?

A lot has changed this year:


 **In-person services** of the Family Service, Evensong, Compline, and weekday Holy Eucharists, **have resumed**

 The 10:00 am Holy Eucharist can now be **watched via livestream** on YouTube each Sunday

 **The Church School** meets in-person each week on the Church lawn and grounds

 **Virtual meetings** are still under way for many ministries including Bible Study, Finance, and the Vestry


 **Construction projects** throughout the building are nearing completion

 **Outreach to the community:** The Breakfast Program remains open for take-out meals




The continued financial impact of Covid-19 at St. Andrew's

The 2021 budget of \$1,010,094 was approved in December 2020

 While receiving a **PPP loan has helped offset the cost of staff salaries**, Administration - including staff salaries and benefits - accounts for \$292,927 (29%) of our budget

 Without in-person services our **plate income is more than \$9,000 behind budget**

 Through July, **2021 pledge payments have fallen \$34,700 behind budget**

It is **your continued financial support** to the parish which allows us to maintain the level of ministry and worship we currently enjoy.

St. Andrew's 2021 Budget: \$1,010,094

Expenses at St. Andrew's can be categorized into one of six areas of ministry (listed below). Here are just a few examples of the many things each ministry pays for:

Last Year's Annual Giving Campaign

For the 2021 campaign, **40 percent** of the parish's **602 households** pledged an average of **\$3,242**.

We received **240 Pledges** for a total of \$778,080.

19 Decreased from 2020	130 No Change from 2020



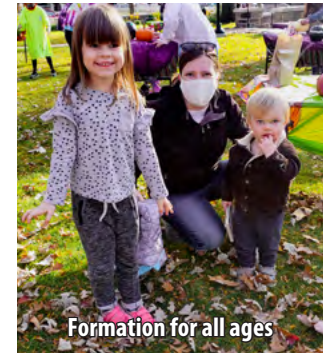

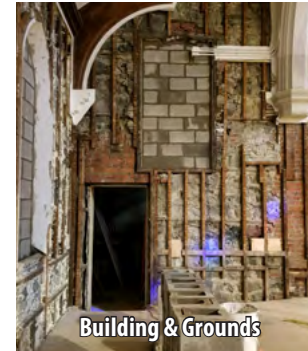

THE EUCHARIST

The celebration of the Holy Eucharist is an act of joy and praise, which draws its principal meaning from the Easter proclamation of the resurrection. All who are drawn to God and seek Christ are welcome to receive communion.

Wafers will be used for the communion bread. Wine will not be offered. Communion will be distributed at the foot of the chancel steps for those wishing to partake. Ushers will direct you to form a single line down the center aisle as you approach the altar.

2022 ANNUAL GIVING

We have heard from 43% of our Early Givers. A total of 23 families have committed \$195,476 for 22% of the \$900,000 goal for 2022.
