THE EUCHARIST

The celebration of the Holy Eucharist is an act of joy and praise, which draws its principal meaning from the Easter proclamation of the resurrection. All who are drawn to God and seek Christ are welcome to receive communion.

Wafers will be used for the communion bread. Wine will not be offered. Communion will be distributed at the foot of the chancel steps for those wishing to partake. Ushers will direct you to form a single line down the center aisle as you approach the altar.

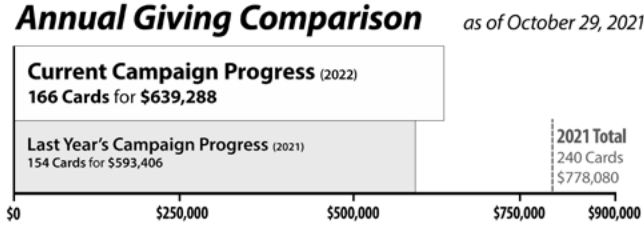

MUSIC NOTES

Hymn 551: Rise up, ye saints of God

As we anticipate the feast of All Saints tomorrow, we hear a strong call to service for all us saints. William Merrill, a Presbyterian minister, wrote this text while on a steamer going across Lake Michigan to Chicago in 1911. He had two inspirations: a colleague who had mentioned a need for a "brotherhood hymn" and an article called "The Church of the Strong Men." Merrill later remembered being on that steamer, "when suddenly this hymn came up, almost without conscious effort." Many people objected to its strong masculine language (its original first line was "Rise up, O men of God"); so, many hymnals, including ours, have made revisions to include all Christians. -- Donna Wessel Walker
