**THE EUCHARIST**

The celebration of the Holy Eucharist is an act of joy and praise, which draws its principal meaning from the Easter proclamation of the resurrection. All who are drawn to God and seek Christ are welcome to receive communion.

Wafers will be used for the communion bread. Wine will not be offered. Communion will be distributed at the foot of the chancel steps for those wishing to partake. Ushers will direct you to form a single line down the center aisle as you approach the altar.

**CHILDREN**

A Nursery for infants through toddler age is available during the 10:00 am service, located on the second floor of the Parish Hall. Children and youth in preschool through high school attend Church School from 9:45 am until they join their families during the Children's Entrance Hymn.

## MUSIC NOTES

**Hymn 571: All Who Love and Serve your City** This haunting hymn comes from two very different sources. Erik Routley wrote this, his first hymn text, in 1966 at a conference in Dublanc, Scotland where he was challenged to write a hymn of Christian social responsibility. He had traveled and taught in the US and was moved by the upheaval and suffering in America's cities; his text beautifully captures a lament for human cities and a longing for the City of God. The tune comes from the Sacred Harp tradition of early 19th-century America; it has been widely published in many arrangements set to varying texts. This combination seems perfect. -- Donna Wessel Walker

**If You Love Me** (Rene Clausen)  
 Rene Clausen (b. 1953) was choral conductor at Concordia College, Moorhead, Minnesota, from 1986 to 2019. He developed The Concordia Choir into an ensemble that blends rich aesthetic expression, tonal refinement, and technical skill. In 2018, he led the opening performance of the 25th *Summer Sings* series presented by the University Musical Society Choral Union. -- Dennis Powers
