THE EUCHARIST

The celebration of the Holy Eucharist is an act of joy and praise, which draws its principal meaning from the Easter proclamation of the resurrection. All who are drawn to God and seek Christ are welcome to receive communion.

Wafers will be used for the communion bread. An intinction cup will be offered at the direction of the clergy. Communion will be distributed at the foot of the chancel steps for those wishing to partake. Ushers will direct you to form a single line down the center aisle as you approach the altar.





MUSIC NOTES

Hymn 287: For all the Saints

This is the quintessential hymn for the Feast of All Saints: could we celebrate this feast without singing this hymn? The tune is a magnificent statement of the grand themes of the text, embodying the hope and inspiration this hymn gives us. The words invoke the memory of all Christians who have gone before us, encouraging us in our daily battles to remain faithful and hopeful. William Walsham How, the text's author, was a country parson appointed to be a bishop in East London; he was famous for his good work among the poor and the sweetness of his character. -- Donna Wessel Walker

Introit (Requiem, Op. 9) (Duruflé)

Maurice Duruflé (1902-1986), organist at the Church of Saint-Etienne-du-Mont in Paris, based his setting of the Requiem Mass on a set of sketches for a suite of organ works based on Gregorian Chant. Abandoning that project, he used those sketches instead as the foundation for this new choral work published in 1948. All nine movements are based on the traditional *Missa pro Defunctis* (Mass for the Departed) as chanted by the monks at Solesmes Abbey south of Paris; their work at recovering the pure form of chant as it was originally sung did much to reinvigorate the Roman Catholic liturgy in the 20th century. Duruflé was a chorister at the Rouen Cathedral's Choir School from 1912 to 1928, and the choral plainsong tradition that he assimilated there became a strong and lasting influence on his work. Duruflé's *Requiem* is traditional in form and tone. However, as this evening's performance of the full work will demonstrate, his *Requiem* is also rich in nontraditional harmonies and colorful orchestration. -- Dennis Powers
