THE EUCHARIST

The celebration of the Holy Eucharist is an act of joy and praise, which draws its principal meaning from the Easter proclamation of the resurrection. All who are drawn to God and seek Christ are welcome to receive communion.

Wafers will be used for the communion bread. Wine will not be offered. Communion will be distributed at the foot of the chancel steps for those wishing to partake. Ushers will direct you to form a single line down the center aisle as you approach the altar.

MUSIC NOTES

Hymn 619: Sing Alleluia Forth
During Lent, we give up saying or singing "alleluia"; when Easter comes, we acclaim "Alleluia!" with renewed joy through the whole of Eastertide. This hymn is a perfect expression of that renewed joy, the irresistible music lifting us to "an endless alleluia" that is not just "duteous" (as in the first line) but exuberant. The verses echo the description of heavenly worship we hear in the reading from Revelation this morning, giving us a sense of being part of the whole host of heaven. The text dates to at least the 10th century, and may be older; the tune was written for the English translation in 1913. -- Donna Wessel Walker
