THE EUCHARIST

The celebration of the Holy Eucharist is an act of joy and praise, which draws its principal meaning from the Easter proclamation of the resurrection. All who are drawn to God and seek Christ are welcome to receive communion.

Wafers will be used for the communion bread. Wine will not be offered. Communion will be distributed at the foot of the chancel steps for those wishing to partake. Ushers will direct you to form a single line down the center aisle as you approach the altar.

TRANSITION UPDATE

The Vestry met on May 10th to develop criteria to guide us in the formation of the Search Committee to find a new rector for St. Andrew's. It is so important to have a committee that is representative of the whole parish. The church website lists the ministries at St. Andrew's, and we will use this as a guide, recruiting people with personal experience in these ministries and a demonstrated involvement in the life of St. Andrew's.

Our next step will be to form the Search Committee. They will begin the work of meeting with you to learn about your thoughts, concerns, hopes, and dreams for our parish. They will need

your prayerful and considered input so that they can write a parish profile to be used to tell candidates who we are and what we value.

Efficient and effective communication throughout this transition process is critical. The Vestry will be in regular contact with the Search Committee, and we will provide regular updates in the Sunday bulletin each month after our regular Vestry meeting. And you can always call us, send us an email, or grab us at church if you have questions or concerns. Your voice is important to us and to this process.

MUSIC NOTES

Hymn 296: We Know that Christ is Raised
 The scriptural basis of this hymn is Romans 6:9: "We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him." But the immediate impetus for the text was an effort in the 1960's to create living cells in a Cambridge University laboratory. Rev. John B. Geyer (b. 1932), a Congregationalist minister, was teaching at Cambridge then; in 1967 he wrote this hymn to connect Christian baptism (the creation of new spiritual life) to the creation of living cells in the laboratory. The original text had several scientific metaphors that have since been edited out, leaving a stronger text that will not grow dated as scientific knowledge progresses. -- Donna Wessel Walker
