THE EUCHARIST

The celebration of the Holy Eucharist is an act of joy and praise, which draws its principal meaning from the Easter proclamation of the resurrection. All who are drawn to God and seek Christ are welcome to receive communion.

Wafers will be used for the communion bread. Wine will not be offered. Communion will be distributed at the foot of the chancel steps for those wishing to partake. Ushers will direct you to form a single line down the center aisle as you approach the altar.

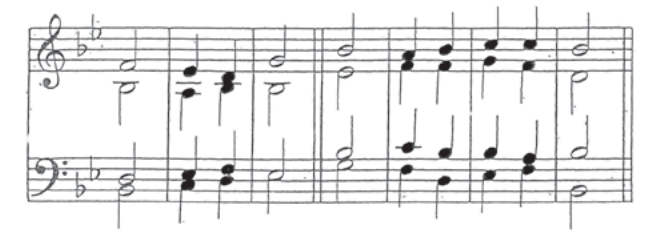

Annual Parish Meeting Sunday, January 30 at 11:30 am

The Annual Parish meeting will be held in the Church on January 30, 2022 immediately following the conclusion of the 10:00 am service.

So that all parishioners have an opportunity to vote that does not require attending a meeting with 100+ people in a room, new voting procedures will be introduced.

The annual meeting will be called to order at the conclusion of the 8:00 am service and the polls will open.

Ballots will be available in the vestibule at the Memorial Garden entrance. Polls will remain open throughout the

morning at a table staffed by members of the vestry.

People not attending church services to avoid crowds may stop in to cast their votes in-between services, minimizing their contact with other people. At the conclusion of the 10:00 am service final ballots will be cast, and the business portion of the meeting will commence.

Those who are not comfortable entering the building may call or text Catherine Carver from the church parking lot at 202-222-8753, and a ballot will be brought to their car.

This satisfies the bylaw requirement for a physical ballot being cast at the annual meeting while giving parishioners more flexibility in how/when they vote. However, those who do not stay or return for the business meeting would not get an opportunity to vote in a second ballot if one is needed.

MUSIC NOTES

Hymn 135: *Songs of Thankfulness and Praise*

This hymn is one of the few that mentions the story of the wedding at Cana, our Gospel lesson for today. It is also an excellent summary of all the themes of Epiphany, which means to show plainly or "make manifest;" so, this hymn repeats the word "manifest" in every verse. The first three stanzas by Christopher Wordsworth describe the star leading the Wise Men, Jesus' baptism, the wedding at Cana, healings, and Jesus' temptation. F. Bland Tucker added the last verse, bringing the hymn to the mountain of the Transfiguration, so the hymn spans all of Epiphanytide. -- *Donna Wessel Walker*
