**THE EUCHARIST**

The celebration of the Holy Eucharist is an act of joy and praise, which draws its principal meaning from the Easter proclamation of the resurrection. All who are drawn to God and seek Christ are welcome to receive communion.

Wafers will be used for the communion bread. Wine will not be offered. Communion will be distributed at the foot of the chancel steps for those wishing to partake. Ushers will direct you to form a single line down the center aisle as you approach the altar.

## MUSIC NOTES

### Hymn 701: Jesus all my Gladness

The combination of words and music in this hymn give deep expression of the kind of love shown by Mary of Bethany anointing Jesus in today's Gospel lesson. The words express a joy that is too profound for mere cheeriness, and inspire thoughtful, honest trust. The music is full of pathos and yearning but never loses its dignity. This great Reformation hymn dates to the middle of the 17th century: the German text was matched with this tune in 1656 and has never been separated from it. J. S. Bach used the music for a motet and several cantatas.
