ABOUT MAUNDY THURSDAY

“On the night before he was betrayed,” Thursday in Holy Week, Jesus instituted the Eucharist at his last supper with his disciples. The Gospel of John says that, on that occasion just before his crucifixion, Jesus emphasized his role as God’s servant by washing the disciples’ feet, a task usually reserved for slaves in that world of dusty roads and sandaled feet. As he did that, he said, “I give you a new commandment: Love one another as I have loved you.” In Latin “a new commandment” is *mandatum novum* - hence, “Maundy” Thursday.

In today’s Liturgy the Eucharist is preceded by a symbolic footwashing of members of the congregation by their leaders in remembrance of Christ’s self-sacrificing love. At the conclusion of the service the altar and sanctuary are stripped of adornments, and remain that way through Good Friday until the Great Vigil on Easter.
