THE EUCHARIST

Wafers will be used for the communion bread. Wine will not be offered. Communion will be distributed at the foot of the chancel steps for those wishing to partake. Ushers will direct you to form a single line down the center aisle as you approach the altar.

MUSIC NOTES

Hymn 610: Lord, whose love through humble service Just over 60 years ago, the Hymn Society and the National Council of Churches issued a call for hymns connecting worship and active service: so Albert Bayly, a Congregational minister in Great Britain, wrote this text. The hymn reminds us of God's goodness in every verse and calls us to respond in worship; it also reminds us of the deep needs all around us and calls us to respond with service as fervent as our prayer. It was chosen as the Conference Hymn for the National Conference of Churches and Social Welfare held in Cleveland in 1961 and is still relevant today. -- Donna Wessel Walker
