THE EUCHARIST

MUSIC NOTES

Hymn 488: *Be thou my Vision*

This beautiful Irish hymn is very ancient: it may go back as far as 700 AD. Drawing on ancient Irish politics, the text refers to God as the "High King of Heaven": for centuries Ireland acknowledged a High King, who ruled from the mountain Tara. The tune is named for Slane, a hill about ten miles from Tara; Slane is the place where St. Patrick defied the king by striking the Paschal fire before the king lit the pagan Beltane fire on Tara. So even the music celebrates Christ as the High King of Heaven.
