Over its five verses the text gradually builds from the first hopes and prayers for the kingdom throughout the Church's history, to a vision of the light of Christ dawning through the darkness to shine with the fullness of peace and righteousness. The tune's walking pace allows us to follow the progression of the text. Dating back to 16th-century psalters, the melody has proven its usefulness for many texts and with several variations in harmony and rhythm. -- Donna Wessel Walker

## THE EUCHARIST

The celebration of the Holy Eucharist is an act of joy and praise, which draws its principal meaning from the Easter proclamation of the resurrection. All who are drawn to God and seek Christ are welcome to receive communion.

Wafers will be used for the communion bread. An intinction cup will be offered at the direction of the clergy. Communion will be distributed at the foot of the chancel steps for those wishing to partake. Ushers will direct you to form a single line down the center aisle as you approach the altar.
