## MUSIC NOTES

**Hymn 665: All my hope on God is founded**

This hymn was first written as a grace after family meals in the German Pietist community in the 17th century. English Poet Laureate Robert Bridges (1844-1930) made a free rendition of the original text, widening its scope to include larger concerns: faith's opposition to all false claims of military and political power; the joy God gives us in the world; and the response of all creation to God in universal praise. Such creative adaptation allows us to respond to the warnings given in today's lessons with an affirmation of trust in God. -- Donna Wessel Walker

## THE EUCHARIST

Communion will be distributed at the foot of the chancel steps for those wishing to partake. Ushers will direct you to form a single line down the center aisle as you approach the altar.
