MUSIC NOTES

Hymn 317: *This is the Hour*

This text is part of a much longer communion hymn; the words to Hymn 318 are also among the original ten verses written in 1855. Horatius Bonar (1808-1889), the author, was a member of a prominent Scottish Presbyterian family and one of the founders of the Free Church of Scotland in 1843; he was known for his scholarship, faith, and warmth. This tune, written in 1964, was named for a village near Winchester, England, where its composer, Sidney Watson, used to bicycle on his way to the cathedral: he wanted to "remember the lovely country in this part of Hampshire." -- Donna Wessel Walker

The celebration of the Holy Eucharist is an act of joy and praise, which draws its principal meaning from the Easter proclamation of the resurrection. All who are drawn to God and seek Christ are welcome to receive communion.

Wafers will be used for the communion bread. An intinction cup will be offered at the direction of the clergy. Communion will be distributed at the foot of the chancel steps for those wishing to partake. Ushers will direct you to form a single line down the center aisle as you approach the altar.
