MUSIC NOTES

LEVAS 154: *O Taste and See*

This contemporary hymn was written by James E. Moore (b. 1951), who also wrote a setting for the Advent text, "Prepare the Way of the Lord." A liturgical musician, composer, and consultant, Dr. Moore served various churches in Ohio before moving to Vienna. The words are drawn from Psalm 34, arranged in verses with a simple refrain; at the Eucharist, this text connects the bread and wine of the liturgy to our daily bread, and so draws us to receive all forms of God's nourishment. -- *Donna Wessel Walker*

The celebration of the Holy Eucharist is an act of joy and praise, which draws its principal meaning from the Easter proclamation of the resurrection. All who are drawn to God and seek Christ are welcome to receive communion.

Wafers will be used for the communion bread. An intinction cup will be offered at the direction of the clergy. Communion will be distributed at the foot of the chancel steps for those wishing to partake. Ushers will direct you to form a single line down the center aisle as you approach the altar.
