## MUSIC NOTES

**Hymn 314: Humbly I Adore Thee**

This is one of the most beautiful expressions of humble worship in our hymnal. It is said that St. Thomas Aquinas wrote it for the then-new feast of Corpus Christi. The English translation, based on work by the Victorian scholar John Mason Neale, was modernized for Hymnal 1982. The poem is a profound, personal meditation on the Eucharist, expressing the yearning of the soul for Christ and the quiet joy of trust in him. The melody, which comes from the late 17th century, is both stirring and dignified. -- Donna Wessel Walker
