Wafers will be used for the communion bread. An intinction cup will be offered at the direction of the clergy. Communion will be distributed at the foot of the chancel steps for those wishing to partake. Ushers will direct you to form a single line down the center aisle as you approach the altar.

## MUSIC NOTES

**Hymn 314: *Humbly I Adore Thee***

The parable in today's gospel praises the sinner who could only implore the mercy of God. Surely there is no more beautiful an expression of such humble worship than this communion hymn attributed to St. Thomas Aquinas. The English translation, based on work by the Victorian scholar John Mason Neale, was modernized for *Hymnal 1982*. The poem is a profound, personal meditation on Eucharist, expressing the soul's yearning for Christ and the quiet joy of trust in him. The melody, which comes from the late 17th century, is both stirring and dignified. -- *Donna Wessel Walker*

**The Pharisee and the Publican** (Schutz) Heinrich Schultz (1586-1672) adds drama to this depiction of the parable from the Gospel of Luke (18:10-14) by employing two soloists. a baritone and a tenor, who assume the roles of the Pharisee and the Publican. There is much interplay between their two parts, illustrating the difference between the characters of the two men, while the words of Jesus are sung by the full choir. The contrast between the ascending lines of "exalt" and the descending lines of "humble" illustrates the meaning of the text. -- *Dennis Powers*
