THE EUCHARIST

The celebration of the Holy Eucharist is an act of joy and praise, which draws its principal meaning from the Easter proclamation of the resurrection. All who are drawn to God and seek Christ are welcome to receive communion.

Wafers will be used for the communion bread. An intinction cup will be offered at the direction of the clergy. Communion will be distributed at the foot of the chancel steps for those wishing to partake. Ushers will direct

you to form a single line down the center aisle as you approach the altar.

CHILDREN

A Nursery for infants through toddler age is available during the 10:00 am service, located on the second floor of the Parish Hall.

Children and youth in preschool through high school attend Church School from 9:45 am until they join their families during the Children's Entrance Hymn.

Preschool Families: Please pick up your child in the Morning Glories Preschool class in time for the Children's Entrance Hymn. Our younger ones are not escorted into the sanctuary and **need to be picked up by a parent**, not a sibling.

MUSIC NOTES

Hymn 598: *Lord Christ, when first thou cam'st to earth* The lessons this morning anticipate the Advent themes of judgment and warning, as does this rather severe text. It describes the ways human beings have rejected the love of God until the last verse, which asks Christ to "finish our salvation." Written at the request of the dean of Liverpool Cathedral for Advent in 1928, this text is regarded as a masterpiece in applying biblical themes to contemporary life. The author, Walter Russell Bowie (1882-1969), wrote that "it is an effort to express both the solemnity and inspiration of the thought of Christ coming into our modern world in judgment." -- *Donna Wessel Walker*

Here, O My Lord (Swenson) The text of this morning's anthem was written in the mid 1800's by Horatius Bonar, an Scottish churchman and poet who today principally is remembered as a prodigious hymnist. The tune NYACK, to which the text is set, is itself the prize-winning hymn in a 1977 competition held by the Episcopal Diocese of New York for performance at its First Diocesan Festival of Music and Worship. Kevin Robinson arranged the piece as an anthem for the Choir of Trinity Episcopal Church, Florence, Alabama. -- *Dennis Powers*
