
Spring Fund Drive for Food Gatherers

MUSIC NOTES

Hymn 664: My Shepherd will Supply my Need This is perhaps the loveliest tune to come from the shape-note tradition. The slow, rising swells echo the growth of confidence and trust the words express, giving expressiveness to the response in the third line before drawing back to a quiet reprise of the first musical phrase. David Hurd's harmony in the accompaniment quietly supports the melody we sing. Isaac Watts, the great 18th-century hymn writer, made this paraphrase of Psalm 23, adding his own words in the last half-verse. These lines bring an already-personal psalm into the intimacy of our heart, superbly expressed in the calming final phrase in the music. -- Donna Wessel Walker

Listen to the Lambs (Dett) Nathaniel Dett (1882-1943) was the first black American to graduate, in 1907, from the Oberlin Conservatory of Music. His exposure at Oberlin to the works of Antonin Dvorak, who incorporated elements of American folk song into his symphonic works, led to his own focus on integrating spirituals into classical musical compositions. In 1920, he won the Bowdoin and Frances Boott prizes from Harvard University for his paper, *The Emancipation of Negro Music*. -- Dennis Powers
