THE EUCHARIST

The celebration of the Holy Eucharist is an act of joy and praise, which draws its principal meaning from the Easter proclamation of the resurrection. All who are drawn to God and seek Christ are welcome to receive communion.

We receive communion by extending our hands for the bread, either eating it and receiving the wine from the chalice or holding the bread and waiting for the small intinction cup in which to dip it.

Consecrated rice wafers are available for those with wheat allergies. Please ask the priest at the time of your communion if you desire one.

A Nursery for infants through toddler age is available during the 10:00 am service, located on the second floor of the Parish Hall. **Children and youth in preschool through high school** attend Church School from 9:45 am until they join their families during the Children's Entrance Hymn. MUSIC NOTES

Hymn 292: O Jesus, crowned with all renown Today is Rogation Sunday, and it is a long-standing tradition at St. Andrew's to sing this hymn on this day. The text embraces all the meanings and uses of Rogation Day: it celebrates the gifts of the good earth, honors the labor of all who produce food and contribute to the common good in other ways, and ends with a prayer that we may use the gifts of creation to serve the poor and to worship God. The tune is based on an Anglo-Irish folk tune, "Star of the County Down," popular among folk musicians and arranged here by Ralph Vaughan Williams. -- Donna Wessel Walker

In Sacred Manner (Pavlevhko) Thomas Pavlevhko (b. 1962) is the Cantor and Composer-in-Residence at St. Martin's Lutheran Church in Austin, Texas, where he previously served as Director of Music and Principal Organist from 1994 to 2000. In 2006, the Church Publishing Company commissioned him to co-edit the new primary worship planning books for the Episcopal Church, *Liturgical Music for the Revised Common Lectionary*, published in three volumes between 2007 and 2009. -- Dennis Powers
