THE EUCHARIST

The celebration of the Holy Eucharist is an act of joy and praise, which draws its principal meaning from the Easter proclamation of the resurrection. All who are drawn to God and seek Christ are welcome to receive communion.

We receive communion by extending our hands for the bread, either eating it and receiving the wine from the chalice or holding the bread and waiting for the small intinction cup in which to dip it.

Consecrated rice wafers are available for those with wheat allergies. Please ask the priest at the time of your communion if you desire one.

CHILDREN

A Nursery for infants through toddler age is available during the 10:00 am service, located on the second floor of the Parish Hall. **Children and youth in preschool through high school** attend Church School from 9:45 am until they join their families during the Children's Entrance Hymn. Preschoolers need to be picked up by a parent.

Hymn 215: See the Conqueror

This great Ascension hymn celebrates Christ's victory without forgetting what it cost him, or his grace in sharing with us the benefits of his triumph. The text's author Christopher Wordsworth (1807-1885), nephew of the great English poet William Wordsworth, was first headmaster of Harrow School and later Bishop of Lincoln; between those two very public roles he served an obscure country parish where he wrote many hymns. The tune is from an 18th-century Dutch book of folk songs and contra-dances. -- Donna Wessel Walker

Lift Up Your Heads, O Ye Gates (Aston) Peter Aston (1938-2013), a longtime professor of composition at the University of East Anglia in Norwich, England, was a Lay Canon of Norwich Cathedral and founded the Norwich Festival of Contemporary Church Music. -- Dennis Powers
