If you have a hearing aid equipped with telecoil capability, please note that the church sanctuary has been equipped with this technology.

On Sunday mornings masks are required in all services and Church School classes. Lectors, Intercessors, Preachers, and Celebrants may choose to remove their masks while serving in those capacities. Celebrants and Eucharistic Ministers will wear a mask while distributing Holy Communion. **At other times, throughout the building, masks are recommended but not required.**

THE EUCHARIST

The celebration of the Holy Eucharist is an act of joy and praise, which draws its principal meaning from the Easter proclamation of the resurrection. All who are drawn to God and seek Christ are welcome to receive communion.

Wafers will be used for the communion bread. An intinction cup will be offered at the direction of the clergy. Communion will be distributed at the foot of the chancel steps for those wishing to partake. Ushers will direct you to form a single line down the center aisle as you approach the altar.
