THE EUCHARIST

The celebration of the Holy Eucharist is an act of joy and praise, which draws its principal meaning from the Easter proclamation of the resurrection. All who are drawn to God and seek Christ are welcome to receive communion.

Wafers will be used for the communion bread. An intinction cup will be offered at the direction of the clergy. Communion will be distributed at the foot of the chancel steps for those wishing to partake. Ushers will direct you to form a single line down the center aisle as you approach the altar.

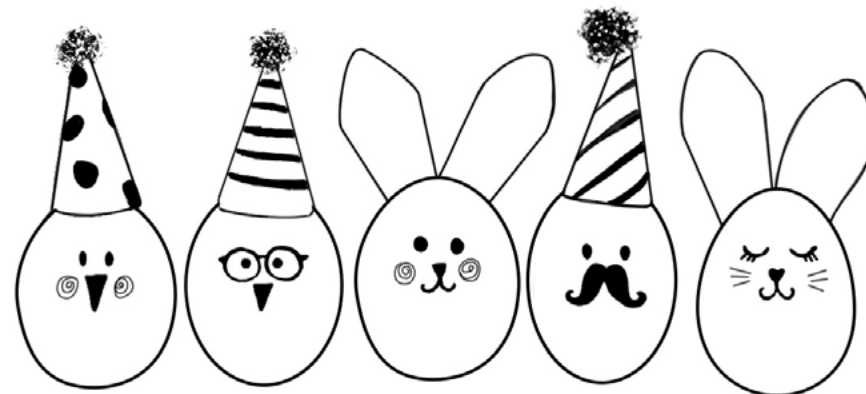
A Service of Remembrance and Reconciliation

MUSIC NOTES

Hymn 335: I am the Bread of Life

This hymn quotes directly from this morning's Gospel lesson in which Jesus repeats his bold claim to be the bread of life, answers objections to that claim and ends with his stunning raising of Lazarus Suzanne Toolan, a Sister of Mercy who was born in Lansing, composed this hymn in 1966 for her convent in San Francisco. Although she doubted that it would succeed, this hymn has spread all over the world in many different languages. The moving hymn, which can be sung simply with guitar or with the "full cathedral" treatment of organ and brass, gives fine expression to our faith and hope. -- Donna Wessel Walker

Psalm 130 (Ferguson)

John Ferguson (b. 1941) is the Elliot and Klara Stockdal Johnson Professor of Organ and Church Music, and Cantor to the Student Congregation, at St. Olaf College in Northfield, Minnesota. A native of Cleveland, he holds degrees from Oberlin College (B.M.), Kent State University (M.M.) and the Eastman School of Music (D.M.A.). His anthem "Who Is This" received the 2005 Raebe Prize for Excellence in Sacred Composition. -- Dennis Powers
