THE EUCHARIST

The celebration of the Holy Eucharist is an act of joy and praise, which draws its principal meaning from the Easter proclamation of the resurrection. All who are drawn to God and seek Christ are welcome to receive communion.

We receive communion by extending our hands for the bread, either eating it and receiving the wine from the chalice or holding the bread and waiting for the small intinction cup in which to dip it.

Consecrated rice wafers are available for those with wheat allergies. Please ask the priest at the time of your communion if you desire one.

MUSIC NOTES

Hymn 226: Come, thou Holy Spirit Both text and music of this sequence hymn have been edited to restore its liveliness and beauty. The text is a modern translation of a medieval Latin hymn, "Veni Sancte Spiritus." The original author is unknown, but the text is very famous, and much admired for its eloquence: it is known as "the Golden Sequence" hymn. Our translation seeks to retain the structure and rhyme scheme of the original Latin. The 20th-century arranger of the music restored the dancing three-beat rhythm to the plainsong melody, pointing out that this tune was also used for dancing. -- *Donna Wessel Walker*

Song 44: Veni Creator (Gibbons) Orlando Gibbons (1583-1625) became a Gentleman Extraordinary (an unpaid substitute awaiting the vacancy of a paid position) in the Chapel Royal, a sizable group of priests and musicians who attend the King and the royal household, in 1603. Two years later, he became a full-fledged Gentleman as the Chapel's junior organist. He eventually succeeded John Parsons as organist of Westminster Abbey in 1623. This morning's anthem, a setting of an English translation of the hymn *Veni Creator Spiritus*, was published in George Wither's collection *The Hymnes and Songs of the Church* (1623). -- *Dennis Powers*
