Memorial Garden Prices to Increase

*On January 1, 2024, the price of a space in our Memorial Garden will increase from \$500 to \$750.*

It has been nearly 20 years since we last adjusted the price of interment spaces in the Memorial Garden. In that time the costs of brass name ribbons and plaques on the church wall have increased greatly, as have expenses of maintenance and gardening.

You can purchase a space at the current price until December 31, 2023. On January 1, 2025, the cost will again increase to \$1,000 each.
