MUSIC NOTES

Hymn 516: Come down, O Love Divine
This fervently personal invocation of the Holy Spirit came into English worship through the efforts of its translator, R. F. Littledale, a leader in the 19th-century Anglo-Catholic movement. The tune, though it sounds like a folk tune, was composed by the famous composer Ralph Vaughan Williams, and named for the Gloucestershire village where he was born. Vaughan Williams studied folk music, and brought many folk and folk-style tunes into the *English Hymnal* of 1906, for which he was music editor. This is a hymn to be sung from the heart; it expresses the yearning of a soul drawn to God. -- *Donna Wessel Walker*

Frank Ferko (b. 1950) is known for his adept text setting for a *capella* choral ensembles. He was Composer-in-Residence with the Dale Warland Singers, long regarded as one of America’s finest a *cappella* choirs, from 2001 to 2003. -- *Dennis Powers*
