**THE EUCHARIST**

The celebration of the Holy Eucharist is an act of joy and praise, which draws its principal meaning from the Easter proclamation of the resurrection. All who are drawn to God and seek Christ are welcome to receive communion.

Please come forward and stand or kneel at the rail. The priest will place the bread in your outstretched palm (Consecrated rice wafers are available for those with wheat allergies - simply ask the priest). You may dip (intinct) the wafer in the wine in the small cup held by the Eucharistic minister. Alternatively, you may indicate your desire to drink from the common chalice by consuming the bread and remaining at the rail after the Eucharistic minister passes; another Eucharistic minister will bring the large chalice over for you to drink from directly.

Please know that Christ is fully present in both the bread and the wine - there is no requirement to receive both. If you do not wish to receive communion, you may come forward, cross your hands over your chest, and receive a blessing.

**MUSIC NOTES**

**Hymn 659:** *O Master let me walk with thee*

This hymn, following the radical inclusion of today's Gospel, encourages us to focus on the service we offer, no matter how low or high it may be, seeking in it only to be nearer to Jesus. William Gladden, the author of this text, was a Congregationalist minister who served for more than 30 years in Columbus, Ohio, earning a national reputation for his preaching. The contemporary setting by Calvin Hampton brings out the thoughtfulness of this text; the tune is named for Vernon de Tar, a well-known organist who was our own Mary Bates' great uncle. -- *Donna Wessel Walker*

**Simile Est Regnum Caelorum** (Guerrero)

The parable of the laborers in the vineyard (Matthew 19:20-20:16), like any good story, lends itself to a variety of readings. This morning's anthem by Francisco Guerrero (1528-1599) aurally casts the story as being about grace, abundant and freely given to all, no matter when we answer the call into the vineyard. The music overflows with joy and assurance; its energy suggests an abiding promise of more to come. -- *Dennis Powers*
