THE EUCHARIST

The celebration of the Holy Eucharist is an act of joy and praise, which draws its principal meaning from the Easter proclamation of the resurrection. All who are drawn to God and seek Christ are welcome to receive communion.

Please come forward and stand or kneel at the rail. The priest will place the bread in your outstretched palm (Consecrated rice wafers are available for those with wheat allergies - simply ask the priest). You may dip (instinct) the wafer in the wine in the small cup held by the Eucharistic minister. Alternatively, you may indicate your desire to drink from the common chalice by consuming the bread and remaining at the rail

after the Eucharistic minister passes; another Eucharistic minister will bring the large chalice over for you to drink from directly.

Please know that Christ is fully present in both the bread and the wine - there is no requirement to receive both. If you do not wish to receive communion, you may come forward, cross your hands over your chest, and receive a blessing.

CHILDREN

A Nursery for infants through toddler age is available during the 10:00 am service, located on the second floor of the Parish Hall. **Children and youth in preschool through high school** attend Church School from 9:45 am until they join their families during the Children's Entrance Hymn. Preschoolers need to be picked up by a parent.

TODAY

The Episcopal Health Ministers will provide **blood pressure screenings** in the church office after both services.

MUSIC NOTES

Hymn 495: Hail, Thou once Despised Jesus
This text is from the evangelical circles
in 18th-century London that included the
Wesleys and John Newton (author of "Amaz-
ing Grace") as well as John Bakewell and
Martin Madan, to whom the Hymnal 1982
attributes these words. The words praise
Christ for his suffering, the atonement he
achieved, and his coming in glory. Our
worship reaches its zenith in the final verse
when, as it quotes Revelation 4, we join the
heavenly host at the throne of God. The
Dutch folk tune entered English hymnody
when Ralph Vaughn Williams included it
in his English Hymnal of 1906. -- Donna
