THE EUCHARIST

The celebration of the Holy Eucharist is an act of joy and praise, which draws its principal meaning from the Easter proclamation of the resurrection. All who are drawn to God and seek Christ are welcome to receive communion.

Please come forward and stand or kneel at the rail. The priest will place the bread in your outstretched palm (Consecrated rice wafers are available for those with wheat allergies - simply ask the priest). You may dip (instinct) the wafer in the wine in the small cup held by the Eucharistic minister. Alternatively, you may indicate your desire to drink from the common chalice by consuming the bread and remaining at the rail after the Eucharistic minister passes; another Eucharistic minister will bring the large

chalice over for you to drink from directly. Please know that Christ is fully present in both the bread and the wine - there is no requirement to receive both. If you do not wish to receive communion, you may come forward, cross your hands over your chest, and receive a blessing.

MUSIC NOTES

Hymn 655: *O Jesus, I have promised to serve thee* John Bode (1816-1874), an English priest, wrote this text for his children's confirmation in the late 1860's; it has since become popular in a variety of English hymnals. In it we confirm our promise to follow Jesus, rejoicing in Jesus' promise to draw us to himself. Our promise relies on him, not on our efforts or supposed sacrifices. The lilting folk tune suits the childlike text. It comes from the Finnish Lutherans and is named Nyland for a province in Finland. -- *Donna Wessel Walker*
