THE FIRST LESSON *Acts 17:22-31*

Paul stood in front of the Areopagus and said, “Athenians, I see how extremely religious you are in every way. For as I went through the city and looked carefully at the objects of your worship, I found among them an altar with the inscription, ‘To an unknown god.’ What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you. The God who made the world and everything in it, he who is LORD of heaven and earth, does not live in shrines made by human hands, nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mortals life and breath and all things. From one ancestor he made all nations to inhabit the whole earth, and he allotted the times of their existence and the boundaries of the places where they would live, so that they would search for God and perhaps grope for him and find him—though indeed he is not far from each one of us. For ‘In him we live and move and have our being’; as even some of your own poets have said, ‘For we too are his offspring.’

Since we are God’s offspring, we ought not to think that the deity is like gold, or silver, or stone, an image formed by the art and imagination of mortals. While God has overlooked the times of human ignorance, now he commands all people everywhere to repent, because he has fixed a day on which he will have the world judged in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed, and of this he has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead.”

THE SECOND LESSON *1 Peter 3:13-22*

Now who will harm you if you are eager to do what is good? But even if you do suffer for doing what is right, you are blessed. Do not fear what they fear, and do not be intimidated, but in your hearts sanctify Christ as Lord. Always be ready to make your defense to anyone who demands from you an accounting for the hope that is in you; yet do it with gentleness and reverence. Keep your conscience clear, so that, when you are maligned, those who abuse you for your good conduct in Christ may be put to shame. For it is better to suffer for doing good, if suffering should be God's will, than to suffer for doing evil. For Christ also suffered for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, in order to bring you to God. He was put to death in the flesh, but made alive in the spirit, in which also he went and made a proclamation to the spirits in prison, who in former times did not obey, when God waited patiently in the days of Noah, during the building of the ark, in which a few, that is, eight persons, were saved through water. And baptism, which this prefigured, now saves you-- not as a removal of dirt from the body, but as an appeal to God for a good conscience, through the resurrection of Jesus Christ, who has gone into heaven and is at the right hand of God, with angels, authorities, and powers made subject to him.

THE SERMON

THE NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son. With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets. We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

THE PRAYERS OF THE PEOPLE *Please stand or kneel.*

Leader Let us pray to God, who loves us into being, sends the Spirit to be our Advocate, and fills the earth with beauty and abundance. *A brief silence* You are the source of every good gift. We give you thanks for this Easter season and for the promise that you will not leave us orphaned. We thank you for the beauty of this day, for the earth coming into fullness around us, for the gardens and green things that proclaim your glory. For your blessings that surround us on every side:

People **We give you thanks, O God.**

You are the foundation of faith. We pray for your holy Church throughout the world, that it may walk in the way of Christ and bear witness to his risen life. In a time of division, draw us toward one another in love. Deepen our common life in faith and service, and make St. Andrew's a place where you may be found by all who seek you. **God of love and mercy, hear our prayer.**

You are the ground of justice. Guide the leaders of this country and all the nations of the earth in the ways of wisdom, truth, and peace. In a time when it is hard to know what is true and harder still to agree, grant our leaders, and all of us, the humility to seek the common good, the courage to speak honestly, and the will to protect the dignity of every person. **God of love and mercy, hear our prayer.**

You are the parent of all. We give you thanks for our mothers: for those who gave us life, those who have shaped us by love, and those who have mothered us in ways we did not expect. We pray for expectant mothers and new mothers, for those who struggle to balance the tasks of work and family, and for mothers of special needs children and children who are ill, who are estranged from their family, or are in any kind of danger or trouble. We pray for those who grieve for the loss of a child, and for those whose desire for a child has not been fulfilled. Bless them, that their love may be deep and tender. **God of love and mercy, hear our prayer.**

You are the creator of earth and sky. On this Rogation Sunday we bless you for the soil and the seed, for rain and sun and the miracle of growing things. We pray for farmers and gardeners, for those who tend the land and those who depend on it. Teach us to receive the earth's abundance with thankfulness, to use its gifts with care, and to be faithful stewards of this world you have entrusted to us. **God of love and mercy, hear our prayer.**

You are health and wholeness. We pray for all who suffer in body, mind, or spirit, and all those carrying illness, grief, anxiety, or loss. We pray especially for those on our prayer list and those we name in our hearts. *Pause* Be near to them, O Lord. Send your Spirit as their Advocate, and bring them your healing and peace. **God of love and mercy, hear our prayer.**

You are the hope for eternity. We pray for those who have died and for all who mourn them. We remember especially Sharon MacBride, in whose memory the flowers are given today, and all those dear to each of us. *Silence* Receive them into the fullness of your light and love, where every longing is fulfilled and every tear wiped away. **God of love and mercy, hear our prayer.**

You are our love and our life. Receive these prayers, offered in the joy of the Resurrection. As we go from this place, singing your praise and blessing the earth you have made, send us out as witnesses to your truth; through Jesus Christ, who is the way, and the truth, and the life. **Amen.**
