Dear friends:

I don't know about you, but I am finding the approach of Advent, Christmas and the New Year to be more of a struggle this year. Perhaps it's the turmoil gripping our political and civic culture, or the ongoing violence all around us (news of another school shooting is unfolding as I write this), or the increasingly alarming outbursts of weather and natural disasters around the world, or maybe it's something more personal like the loss of so many dear people this past year. I'm sure it's a combination of all the above and other factors that are not as prominent on my radar screen. Yet life is a struggle, and to think it might be otherwise is a foolish fantasy. Allan Boesak, a South African pastor and a leader in the anti-apartheid and civil rights movements in that country, who struggled with his own demons both personally and professionally, wrote the following poem that, for me, puts a lot of that in perspective. As part of an Advent discipline I plan to take a few moments each day to read Boesak's words and seek the "truth" he sets before us. May this season lead us all to that life which is "life of the world."

Advent Credo

It is not true that creation and the human family are doomed to destruction and loss—

This is true: For God so loved the world that He gave his only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish but have everlasting life;

It is not true that we must accept inhumanity and discrimination, hunger and poverty, death and destruction—

This is true: I have come that they may have life, and that abundantly.

It is not true that violence and hatred should have the last word, and that war and destruction rule forever—

This is true: Unto us a child is born, unto us a Son is given, and the government shall be upon his shoulder, his name shall be called wonderful counselor, mighty God, the Everlasting, the Prince of peace.

It is not true that we are simply victims of the powers of evil who seek to rule the world—

This is true: To me is given authority in heaven and on earth, and lo I am with you, even until the end of the world.

It is not true that we have to wait for those who are specially gifted, who are the prophets of the Church before we can be peacemakers—

This is true: I will pour out my spirit on all flesh and your sons and daughters shall prophesy, your young men shall see visions and your old men shall have dreams.

It is not true that our hopes for liberation of humankind, of justice, of human dignity of peace are not meant for this earth and for this history—

This is true: The hour comes, and it is now, that the true worshipers shall worship God in spirit and in truth.

So let us enter Advent in hope, even hope against hope. Let us see visions of love and peace and justice. Let us affirm with humility, with joy, with faith, with courage: Jesus Christ—the life of the world.

Stewardship: 2020 Annual Giving Campaign

Dear Friends,

As in years past, the Annual Giving campaign typically extends into the new year, as the Stewardship Committee continues to receive financial pledges from families.

Our campaign goal of \$900,000 represents a budget that would adequately cover St. Andrew's current ministry scope and needs, while also providing us the opportunity to consider meeting needs that could significantly enhance St. Andrew's and the community it serves. Almost all of our operating costs are fixed: utilities, building insurance, staff salaries, etc. And similar to your own household expenses, these costs tend to rise each and every year.

We are very grateful to those of you who have already pledged, and hope that those families, who have not yet turned in a pledge card, will take a few minutes to fill it out and return it to the church. You

can always bring the card to church and drop it in the offering plate or put it in the mail in the envelope provided.

If your pledge is automatically withdrawn from your account on a monthly basis we still need your signed card to continue to make these withdrawals (or- an email to Kathy in the church office to authorize continued automated payments, kmcpherson@standrewsaa.org).

If you are new to the parish, or if you typically place your offering in the plate on Sundays but do not complete a pledge card, it is the committee's hope that you will complete a card this year. The process of budget setting is much easier and more effective if the Finance Committee and Vestry have an estimate of expected incoming monies from each family.

Fundamentally, financial stewardship is about recognizing the importance in your life of God's love and earthly work; and

then making a commitment to honor and reinforce that love and work with a pledge of your resources and gifts. However, St. Andrew's would never ask you to put its needs above that of your family. Making a pledge is not akin to a binding financial commitment. If for whatever reason during the course of the year your situation changes and you need to change the amount or even cancel your pledge, you are free to do so. Please just notify the church office so that we can make the necessary adjustments to the operating budget.

If you need another pledge card, please feel free to contact the office and we will happily mail another.

May God continue to bless you and the ministries of St. Andrew's.

Tales from the Journey

Middle School: Students in Middle School grades 6 and 7 began their first year in the youth program at St. Andrew's. Fondly known as the "middies," they are taking their first steps toward adulthood by exploring new ideas and pondering questions of faith in both fun and serious activities. In addition to lessons and Gospel reflection, they are creating strong bonds of friendship and taking active and visible roles in worship and ministries.

All of this is balanced with affirmations that remind them that they have a voice and make a difference. With the support of youth leaders Sarah Inwood, Mil Taylor and Britt Elder-Tennyson, they are encouraged to share their gifts, work to their strengths, and build community.

High School: Our 8th, 9th and 10th grade students in the High School Youth class have focused their studies on the message of the Gospel readings each week. Discussion, discernment and camaraderie are all meaningful aspects of preparation for their time together on pilgrimage. Fr. Alan frequently visited the class during the autumn months. Along with youth leaders Steve Hastings and Sue McCreadie, they discuss a range of topics, teen concerns and "wows and pows" in a respectful and caring manner.

The teens are learning to work together and share their gifts towards a common goal. Their emerging adulthood responsibilities are taking shape. They have also been very busy planning, organizing, making decisions and learning how to work effectively as a team, as they raise funds and prepare for their pilgrimage. Only a few fundraising events remain to fulfill their pilgrimage goal and while they have been quite busy, they still have fun. Please help support their next event, providing a fantastic luncheon at the St. Nicholas Party. A free will donation towards their pilgrimage in June 2020 is greatly appreciated.

Capstone: Young adults with the guidance of mentors Monica Dering and Jeanine Diller, contemplate their future and embrace adulthood. As they prepare to take responsibility after high school for nurturing their own spiritual life and emerging personal faith, they apply the skills and tools learned in past years.

While they meet just once a month, it is a wonderful engaging, informal opportunity to share stories, sound off and stay grounded not only in their physical and emotional but also their spiritual well-being. They volunteer at the Breakfast Program, meet and discuss contemporary issues, and even are able to squeak in an outing in December to the UofM Men's basketball game.

Washtenaw Reads 2020

Book Discussion at St. Andrew's

The theme of Washtenaw Reads 2020 is "Everybody Counts" and the book's title is Dear America: Notes of an Undocumented Citizen by Jose Antonio Vargas.

The Social Justice Ministry at St. Andrew's will sponsor a discussion of Dear America on Sunday, February 2, 2020 at 11:30 am in the Chapel. Dr. Deborah Kanter, Chair and John S. Ludington Endowed Professor of History at Albion College, will lead the discussion. Dr. Kanter's area of expertise is Latin American History, particularly the Mexican Diaspora. She's also the author of Chicago Católico: Making Catholic Parishes Mexican (University of Illinois Press, forthcoming).

How to Use Qualified Charitable Distributions

Contribute to the church and save income tax at the same time!

A tax break for charitable contributions:

- If you are 70 ½ years old or older, have an IRA, and pay taxes, there is an opportunity to make pledge payments directly from your IRA to St. Andrew's

via QCD (Qualified Charitable Distributions)

- By using QCD to make contributions to the church and other charities you can save income tax
- These contributions count toward the minimum required distributions (RMD) from your IRA
- Ordinarily RMDs show up as income on your 1040 and thus are subject to federal income tax. Contributions to the church via QCD do not show up as income on your 1040 and thus are not subject to income tax
- Even if you take the standard deduction, you can still claim a tax benefit for all donations to a charity via QCD
- This works because the money goes directly from your IRA to the church and does not pass through your hands (bank accounts)

I'm doing it for both my annual pledge and organ pledge, and have saved a bunch of income tax allowing me to increase my pledge without affecting my retirement nest egg.

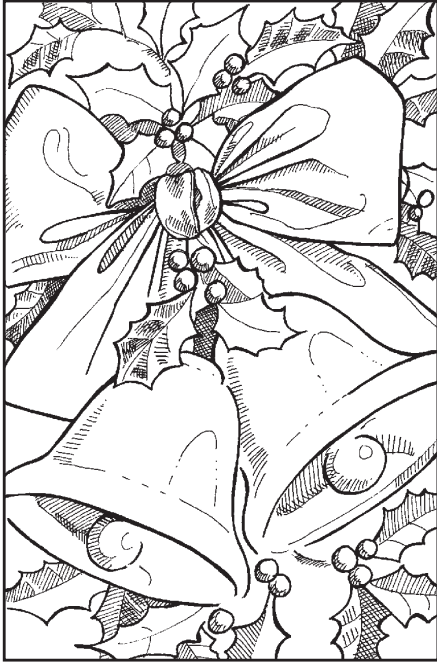
