Dear Friends,

It seems spring is here to stay, and summer is not far behind. We had a beautiful day for Alan's farewell, and it was a joy to see so many gathered for luncheon on the lawn, enjoying time together as we wished him well and said goodbye. We can be glad for him to be in his new home and enjoying his well-deserved retirement. He will always hold a special place in our hearts.

Now we are well into May and our weather continues to improve. The promise of spring, and summer to follow, feels like the right time to begin this new chapter in the history of St. Andrew's. We are learning about the transition process, and the vestry has begun the work we must do to form a Search Committee.

Your wardens are also working with the diocese to find a good interim rector to be with us during the next year or so while the Search Committee does its work. We have found one candidate and the wardens were able to interview him on May 12. **The Wardens have offered the position of interim rector to our candidate, and he has accepted.** We have a verbal agreement and are negotiating the details. As soon as that is done, we will be able to provide you with more information.

The Vestry met on May 10th to begin working on the formation of the Search Committee. It is so important to have a committee that is representative of the whole parish. The church website lists the ministries at St. Andrew's, and we will use these as a guide to recruit people with personal experience in these ministries and a demonstrated involvement in the life of the parish. *(See page 3 for Transition Updates)*

Once the committee is formed, they will come to you to gather the information they need to write a parish profile. They will need your prayerful and considered input in order to write a good profile to tell candidates who we are and what we value. Please share with them your thoughts, hopes, concerns, and dreams for St. Andrew's. They will arrange opportunities for you to talk with them and ask you to fill out a CAT (Church Assessment Tool) to collect data to help write the profile. *Your voice is important to us and to this process.*

The Vestry will keep you informed throughout this time. We will have regular communication with the Search Committee and report on their progress by writing a short Transition Update to be included in the Sunday bulletin after each monthly vestry meeting. And you can always email, call, or text one of us if you have questions or concerns. Our contact information is in the church directory, or you can always speak to us at church.

# Transition Updates

# Director's Chair

## May 15, 2022

The Vestry met on May 10th to develop criteria to guide us in the formation of the Search Committee to find a new rector for St. Andrew's. It is so important to have a committee that is representative of the whole parish. The church website lists the ministries at St. Andrew's, and we will use this as a guide, recruiting people with personal experience in these ministries and a demonstrated involvement in the life of St. Andrew's.

Our next step will be to form the Search Committee. They will begin the work of meeting with you to learn about your thoughts, concerns, hopes, and dreams for our parish. They will need your prayerful and considered input so that they can write a parish profile to be used to tell candidates who we are and what we value.

Efficient and effective communication throughout this transition process is critical. The Vestry will be in regular contact with the Search Committee, and we will provide regular updates in the Sunday bulletin each month after our regular Vestry meeting. And you can always call us, send us an email, or grab us at church if you have questions or concerns. Your voice is important to us and to this process.

## May 22, 2022

As the Vestry works to form the Search Committee we also must work to find an interim rector. We want to let you know that the Diocese has found a candidate. The wardens have interviewed him. We had a very thoughtful and pleasant conversation. Last Monday evening the Vestry was also able to meet him on Zoom. At this point we must maintain confidentiality, however, so we are not able to release details.

As we continue to work on this important part of the transition process, we will keep you informed. We hope to have an interim in place before the end of the summer.

Please continue to keep our parish in your prayers.

## May 29, 2022

The Wardens have offered the position of interim rector to our candidate, and he has accepted. We have a verbal agreement and are negotiating the details. As soon as that is done, we will be able to provide you with more information.

At the Vestry meeting on Tuesday, May 24 we continued working on the formation of the Search Committee. We are making good progress.

## May 31, 2022

Good News! We have a Search Committee! The Committee will be commissioned during the 10:00 am service on Sunday, June 5, 2022. After commissioning, the Committee will meet with the Transition Minister from the Diocese and learn about beginning their work.

It was a long wait for *Peter Pan*, which was canceled in early 2020, and canceled again in 2021. Our performances were finally given May 14 and May 15. It was a wonderful production, with many new faces in the St. Andrew's Players family. The online ticketing site, On the Stage, which we used last year for the virtual production of *Spoon River Anthology*, was again used, with great success. The ticketing was offered at several price levels, allowing for generosity in the fund-raising aspect. Together with a separate donations tab on the site, the production raised over \$3200. There were a few tickets and donations outside of On the Stage, so the total is actually higher. The bulk of the proceeds will go toward the Youth Pilgrimage. The cast and crew worked very hard in *Peter Pan*. The level of creativity, perseverance, and problem solving was amazing. My hat is off to all of the cast, crew, and musicians. It is a huge commitment over a long period of time. And people actually have lives outside of Neverland; who knew!

I have given up predicting the future, but my hope is that next spring we can return to the traditional Supper Theater format, begun in 1993.

Last summer we had some theatrical readings on Zoom, which were a lot of fun. We would meet once a week for an hour, and each time juggle the assignment of parts. It was an opportunity to try on various parts. I am hoping that this summer we can do an in-person version of these readings.

On the subject of generosity, a little miracle occurred during our rehearsals. Our venerable electronic keyboard, a donation of many years ago, has been nearing the end of its useful life for some time. Given the advances in technology, it became clear that spending anything on rejuvenation would not be wise. Our theatrical music director, Mary Bates, investigated modern keyboards and was allowed to bring one for a try-out, a Yamaha P-125. It was immediately clear that the new keyboard represented a major improvement. The next question was how to fund it. While the question hung in the air, JoAnn Socha stepped forward to underwrite the entire cost. From all the Players, thank you JoAnn! At the Saturday performance of *Peter Pan*, the Rev. Sally Boelter dedicated and blessed the instrument. It was a wonderful start to the return of musical theater. ✕



Our organ is now completed, first heard in its full glory on Easter Sunday morning. The reed stops, which were the last stops to be finished, are the crowning glory of the organ, adding brilliance, color and drama to the full organ sound.


Our journey toward completion began with the arrival of the organ in November 2021, and the first Sunday we used the organ in service was December 5, 2021, when we had the 8' foundation stops, which are the stops upon which everything else rests. By Christmas-tide 2021, we had all of the 8' and 4' foundation stops, adding some cheerful color.

By the end of February 2022, we had all of the higher pitched stops that complement the foundation stops, giving us a full chorus with a range of pitches to enjoy. The largest of our reed stops, the pedal 16' Posaune was used April 3, 2022 during the Postlude, and on Palm Sunday, April 10, 2022 we added the 16' and 8' reeds on the swell during the Prelude. Lastly, for Easter Sunday, April 17, 2022, we showcased the entire organ, including the Great Trumpet featured in the final Prelude piece (Carillon de Westminster by Louis Vierne).
