Dear friends:

Are your ears tired? Mine are. The high volume of angry voices, inflammatory 'tweets,' claims and counterclaims (not to mention the physical violence this has sparked) that we have endured this year has left us as a country more divided than ever, and as individuals (speaking for myself) heart-sick and spiritually exhausted. The reasons we find ourselves at this point are as numerous as there are people who hold opinions. It's too easy to point to one person, one party, one group, one way of thinking as the source of our troubles. One election did not create the situation we find ourselves in as Americans. And one election will not resolve our differences. For too long, we have pinned too much expectation on fallible leaders to solve our problems. We forget that in choosing those who will bear the mantle of leadership we only have ourselves as the pool from which to choose candidates.

What can bring about helpful change? What can heal the divisions that have plagued our society for generations? I can't answer that, and I seriously doubt anyone can, or else we would have found resolution long ago. What will not help is for us to retreat into our own affinity groups of like-minded fellow-travelers. Even those groups tend to fall apart when some litmus test raises a difficult challenge.

Just look at our own Episcopal Church. In my lifetime questions such as Prayer Book revision, the ordination of women, divestment of Church assets from the then-apartheid South Africa, full acceptance of LGBT individuals, gay marriage have been just a few of the issues that threatened to divide the Church. Indeed, for some people one or more of these issues was more than they could accept. But, by and large, through it all the Church remained in conversation, tough conversation at times, and continued to bear witness to the love of God for all God's creatures, as flawed as we all are. One thing that made that possible was good leadership, not so much from people who wear their collars backward or who have pointy hats on their heads, but from countless individuals with generous hearts, gracious spirits and open ears, who strove to find more connections than differences with those around them – in their communities, their pews, their homes. These efforts haven't always been perfect, but at least they have sought to build rather than destroy.

Each of us has a capacity to lead in our own way, in our own place. With the summer drawing to a close and a new academic and programmatic year beginning, perhaps now is a good time to recommit ourselves to the work of the Gospel, to the building of God's Kingdom where we find ourselves. I leave you with a prayer I recently stumbled upon in our own Prayer Book (p. 827). Its original intent was surely for those who serve in high places, but I think it is a prayer we can use for ourselves and all sorts of people we don't hear about in the news.

Almighty God, you proclaim your truth in every age by many voices: Direct, in our time, we pray, those who speak where many listen and write what many read; that they may do their part in making the heart of this people wise, its mind sound, and its will righteous; to the honor of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Coventry Supper Sign-Ups

What is a Coventry Supper? During World War II the beautiful cathedral at Coventry, England was nearly destroyed by bombs. The parishioners held evening suppers in their homes as a way of keeping their community together.

St. Andrew's has adopted this concept in an effort to have our community get to know each other better. Most have found these evenings a great way to get to know a new part of the St. Andrew's family.

- Those who sign up will be placed in groups of eight that will gather for potluck suppers during the year.
- After the groups are assigned, one person will call the others to arrange the first gathering. The caller hosts the first supper and provides the main dish. The other members each bring a dish for the meal.
- Each person hosts the group during the year; contact Sharon if you want to join but can't host.
- This is a supper and the purpose is fellowship - not an occasion to drag out the fine linens and silver!
- Each group will decide how often they will gather, but it is suggested that it be at least every four to six weeks.

Kalid Nazif Abajehad

our sponsored child from Ethiopia

Please welcome our new foster brother, Kalid Nazif Abajehad from Ethiopia. Kalid is 12 years old and lives with his mother, father, sister, and two brothers. His father is a peasant farmer and the family lives in a house made of bamboo and mud with a thatched roof and earth floor. They speak Oromo. He attends school about 45 minutes away.

The Church School has sponsored many children over many years and currently partners with Plan International USA to provide the financial means for a child to receive quality education, food/nutrition, clean water and health protection.

Each school year the church school provides a special offering during Advent and Lent or hosts fundraising events to raise the \$350 to sponsor our child. The parish's support is greatly appreciated as it lets the children of St. Andrew's know their efforts make a difference.

Tales from the Journey

The 2017-18 Church School year begins the second year for each of the three Journey to Adulthood segments: Rite 13, J2A and YAC.

The areas of discovery in the Journey to Adulthood program (Self, Sexuality, Spirituality, Society and Prayer/Meditation) introduced last year will now be explored with a deeper and richer dialogue, moving the teens toward taking more responsibility for their own spiritual journey, with less reliance on adult directed responsibility.

Rite 13

Our Rite 13 middle school group continue to experience a guided transformation from childhood to adulthood, concentrating on building community, nurturing self-image, and finally preparing for the Rite 13 Liturgy. In late spring, those nearing their 13th birthdays are welcomed by the congregation with a special rite of passage and recognized as one of God's great gifts in "The Celebration of Manhood and Womanhood."

J2A

The fall brings a number of activities for J2A. They now enter the final year of their preparation and fundraising initiatives for their capstone Pilgrimage to San Diego and the surrounding region in June 2018. Fr. Alan frequently visits the J2A class, interacting with the teens in discussions that emphasize ways in which God actively engages us in the formation of a faithful life, an important facet of their upcoming Pilgrimage. Their planned spiritual journey to San Diego incorporates a contrast of landscapes; the diverse culture of a vibrant city and many elements of nature in the Anza-Borrego Desert region as well as the Pacific Ocean.

YAC

This final segment of the Young Adults in the Church helps teens establish a solid foundation upon which to stand as they enter their young adult years, so that when they graduate from high school they have some experience with "self-directed spiritual formation and understand the importance of individual

prayer, Bible study, as well as the importance of being part of a vibrant and challenging faith community." (© Leader Resources). The YAC will experience a number of contemporary topics at six forums covering the theme of 'Difficult Decisions' with discussions on Doubt/Faith, Depression/Suicide, and Sexuality among others. A separate email for the YAC with dates and greater detail will be sent soon.

Prayer Shawl Ministry

We are so thankful for the gracious support of the prayer shawl makers Lorraine Field, Carol Magee, Sunny Sackett, and Mary White who created shawls for our 2017 graduating seniors.
