Dear Friends:

We are moving into the final weeks of summer with a busy fall season ahead of us. On this day after the Primary Elections here in Michigan and in several other states I wonder, as many, many people do what the fall political campaign season will bring. Or more precisely what damage it will do to our nation and our communities. I will admit that despite all my attempts at moderation, I consume far too much political reporting, editorial and opinion writing; and what I see to be really dangerous is that almost all of it resonates with my own point of view, my own take on "the truth," as if anyone can hold a monopoly on it. Sadly, even in that there is little talk of healing or reconciliation.

So as not to be confusing let me say that facts are fundamentally important. The dissemination of misinformation, misleading statements and out-right lies belong in the trash, and those who promote such discourse should be held accountable. "Facts" are easily verifiable. "Truth" very often falls into that gray area where things like faith, trust and belief live. It must be engaged, tested and lived in order for it to have honest meaning and helpful purpose. One person's truth can be very different from their neighbor's truth, just as one person's faith can be totally unlike another person's faith. It's far too easy to lash out against these differences, which draws the whole pursuit of truth and faith into question, the sad results of which continue to wreak havoc on both a global and local level.

Perhaps instead of trying to proclaim, promote or impose our own "truth," we should first seek to be "truthful" in how we live in and interact with the world and people around us. A poem/prayer by a contemporary Australian poet, Michael Leunig speaks to this aim.

In order to be truthful  
We must do more than speak the truth.  
We must also hear truth.  
We must also receive truth.  
We must also act upon truth.  
The difficult truth.  
Within us and around us.  
We must devote ourselves to truth.  
Otherwise we are dishonest  
And our lives are mistaken.  
God grant us the strength and the courage  
To be truthful.  
Amen.

Alan this fall, the Stewardship committee has arranged for two special Sunday gatherings to further discuss the ministry of St. Andrew's and our role, individually, in supporting it.

**On Sunday, September 16** we will host a brunch and presentation for the Family Service congregation in the lounge at 9:45 am.

**On Sunday, September 23** we will host a brunch in the parish hall at 8:45 am and a presentation starting at 9:00 am for the 8:00 and 10:00 am congregations. ## A PILGRIMAGE to San Diego

In June, Fr. Alan, Ransom Duncan, and I led a group of 10 young men from the J2A class on a pilgrimage to San Diego. One of the goals was to help them consider where they see God in the world. During the trip, we provided a guiding thought for each day, and paired it with activities that allowed us to explore the city. Each day, before breakfast, Fr. Alan spoke to the group about a Saint and offered a question to consider, for example asking us to think about who we should serve with our gifts and abilities on the day we hiked through the desert.

San Diego proved to be a very fertile ground for exploration of faith, from visiting a mission to setting up a youth event with the San Diego Park Service,

there were many opportunities to see the presence of God in nature and in other people. The beauty of nature, observed from day one when we went for a drive to the cliffs overlooking the Pacific Ocean at sunset, was a constant reminder of God's presence. An encounter with bighorn sheep on our hike to the Borrego Springs oasis was truly awe inspiring. Similarly, while kayaking through the La Jolla sea caves, a couple members of our group got too close to a sea lion. Hearing its barking up close really did put the fear of God in them as they paddled backward.

Continuing in the maritime theme, our trip to the USS Midway, an aircraft carrier where over 200,000 sailors served over its 47 years in operation, led us to think of the sacrifices people have made for our country. On the day of our visit, Fr. Alan talked to us about St. Michael the Archangel and the seriousness of war and the tension it creates in a faith that preaches peace.

Not every activity we did was actioned packed. We had an opportunity for contemplation as we walked the labyrinth at St. Paul's Cathedral. Our visit to the Swami meditation garden gave us a glimpse into some of the practices of another faith tradition. One of our pilgrims said that this was a highlight of his trip, as it gave him a chance to slow down with his thoughts while taking in a beautiful vista overlooking the ocean.

On our final day, we decided on an impromptu visit to a park on the border which led to some discussion about immigration, compassion for refugees and the current political climate. As with so much of this trip, this visit was thought provoking in a way that will last longer than the 8 days that we spent together. My hope is that the young men of J2A, in addition to the friendships strengthened on this pilgrimage, will carry some lessons learned forward as they become Young Adults in the Church.


