It's just life. What we must always remember is that in all of life God's love and strength are there to not only sustain us but to inspire us to thrive.

With the return of fall and the resumption of regular routines, I hope we can take this time to reconnect with each other and share the light, and the promise, and the music, and the comradeship that Augustine saw as that which will encourage our souls on this journey of life. It's not complicated, but it does take a commitment to live and not give in to despair. That is God's glorious gift to us.

Dear Friends,

Although hard to believe another year has passed, it is time once again to look toward our Annual Giving Campaign! This campaign seeks pledges of financial support from all St. Andrew's members to sustain all of the operations and ministries of our church home.

The new campaign begins in September, when you will begin to hear about the important ministry of financial stewardship and how it is critical to enabling and supporting God's work week in and week out. The colorful Sunday bulletin covers in late September and October highlight the core ministries that are fundamental to life at St. Andrew's, and provide a tangible sense of what it costs to support the operation of these ministries.

Also in September, you will receive a letter and annual giving brochure asking you to prayerfully consider your annual gift to St. Andrew's. The task for each of us is to consider the value that St. Andrew's brings to your life, and the lives of others in the community, and make a financial pledge that reflects that value.
