St. Andrew's!



Dear friends,

The crisp, cool air this week has been a welcome change from the sticky humidity of recent months. As our young people return to (or begin) school, students come back to campus, and we all settle into more familiar rhythms of life, it is a gift to enjoy the lush green landscape while the weather gently reminds us that fall is on the way.

Like many of us, I'm struggling with the state of the world—the school shooting in Minneapolis; the ongoing wars in Gaza, Ukraine, and elsewhere; the increasingly urgent warnings about climate change; the unprecedented state of our national politics. I want to do something, but it's hard to come up with actions that feel like they will have a meaningful impact. I feel helpless, anxious, and powerless. I know I'm not the only one.

I have been reflecting on how St. Andrew's might care for one another in such times. Our faith offers ways to bring our deepest feelings into God's presence—not to solve every problem, but to steady our hearts, deepen our trust, and remind us that we don't walk alone. This fall we are introducing two opportunities at St. Andrew's that I hope may be helpful:

Centering Prayer & Psalms – Wednesdays at 10:00 am in the Chapel. Together we will spend twenty minutes in silence, read and reflect on a psalm, and then return to silence. Centering prayer is an ancient practice of resting in God's presence, releasing distractions, and opening ourselves to God's love. I learned this practice about fifteen years ago, and have found it deeply grounding and calming. My hope is that it will offer us all a mid-week pause to breathe, listen, and be renewed. If you are unable to join us in person in the Chapel, you can join us on Zoom using [this link](#), or sit in silence at home. On Wednesday, September 3rd, we'll read and reflect on Psalm 13, [found here](#). Please let me know if you would be interested in participating, but need an evening time.

Holy Eucharist & Healing Prayers – The first Thursday of each month at 5:00 pm in the Chapel. This quiet, contemplative service of Eucharist includes prayers for healing, anointing, and the laying on of hands. It is a time to bring before God our own needs and the needs of those we love—for healing of body, mind, spirit, and relationships.

In times when so much feels beyond our control, these practices can help us return to the One who holds us—and all creation—in love. I invite you to join us, and to bring a friend.

I would also like to hear your thoughts and ideas about other ways we might respond faithfully to the challenges of our time and care for one another. Please don't hesitate to share your ideas.

Centering Prayer & Psalms

Wednesdays at 10:00 am in the Chapel and on Zoom, beginning September 3

Centering prayer is an ancient Christian practice of silent contemplation—resting in God's presence, releasing distractions, and opening ourselves to God's love. I began practicing centering prayer about fifteen years ago, and have found it both grounding and calming.

Please join me on Wednesday mornings at 10:00 am in the Chapel. We will spend about twenty minutes in silence, read and reflect on a psalm together, and then return to silence. Breakfast Updates

Happy Anniversary! On August 16, we celebrated the 43rd anniversary of The Breakfast Program. We are deeply grateful for the hundreds of volunteers and donors who have worked together over the years to provide a hot meal and hospitality for those in need.

Thank you, Food Gatherers:

Federal funding for food programs has been reduced or eliminated over the last year, but thanks to the generosity of its many donors, Food Gatherers was able to purchase additional food for the 140 partner programs it supports. Over the last 12 months, the Breakfast Program was blessed to receive 65,476 pounds of food from Food Gatherers. This is the equivalent of 54,458 meals!

Cooking Sessions: This summer we hosted a number of groups from the community for cooking sessions. These work sessions are a wonderful opportunity for new volunteers to learn about the work

we do every day in the St. Andrew's kitchen. Thank you to the teams from Citibank, the Stamps School of Art and Design, Charles Schwab and the U of M Orthopaedic Research Labs for helping us create delicious meals for our guests! Cooking sessions this fall will be held most Thursdays from 10:00 to noon. If you are interested in joining us, you can [sign up here](#).

Thank you, 24 Eagle! In August we said farewell to Larry, Steve and the team at 24 Eagle who have been cleaning for the Breakfast every day for 39 years. We appreciate their dedication to the program, and we wish them well as they enjoy travel and time with grandchildren in their retirement. A new team from JNS Facility Maintenance will clean and sanitize our guest bathrooms daily.

New Volunteer Opportunities: We are adding 3 new positions to our volunteer team every morning. Volunteers on the new "clean-up crew" will wipe down tables and chairs, sweep floors and tidy the lobby and

kitchen after breakfast. The shift starts at 8:15 and ends at 9:30, so it works well for those who like to sleep a little later or cannot commit to a full 2 hour shift in the morning. We hope some of you will consider joining us.

The Breakfast Program and parish will walk together in this year's Ann Arbor CROP Hunger Walk on Sunday, October 5 at 2:00 pm. The walk begins at First United Methodist Church. National Suicide Prevention and Awareness Month

"September, as National Suicide Prevention and Awareness Month, is a time to raise awareness, promote hope, and normalize help-seeking. Suicide affects millions of people every year, yet too many struggle in silence. Whether you're facing challenges, supporting a friend or loved one, or are looking to help, your voice matters. When we stand together in strength, dignity, hope, and purpose, we can make a difference—we can help save lives." (SAMHSA)

The latest Washtenaw County Suicide Report shows promising progress. Suicide attempt rates are declining overall in Washtenaw County---yet men still account for the majority of deaths, and young women aged 10-24 continue to have the highest attempt rates. St. Andrew's Episcopal Health Ministry is highlighting Suicide Prevention and Awareness Month 2025 by doing four things:

- EHM will once again be **handing out Suicide Awareness ribbons** of teal and purple to be worn on Sunday, September 21. Teal symbolizes healing; Purple symbolizes courage, strength and resilience.
- Please check the [EHM Resource List](#) as new Suicide Prevention Resources, such as a Digital Toolkit, have been added.
- A **Self-Care Wheel**, created by Peggy Galimberti, Clinical Director of Garrett's Space, will be featured

Washtenaw County Suicide Report Update

Progress is happening. The work continues.

Overall **suicide attempt rate decreased** from 16.7 attempts per 10,000 population in 2023 to 15.5 in 2024.



Ongoing Concerns:

- ⚠️ 74% of suicide deaths were among men in 2024
- ⚠️ Young adult females aged 10-24 years have consistently had the highest rate of suicide attempts

- EHM will be hosting a **Garrett's Space campus tour** with a hands-on participation project. The tour will be lead by Scott and Julie Halpert, the founder's of Garrett's Space, who were the speakers at the 2024 EHM Fall Forum. Their son, Garrett, died from suicide. They have created this non-medical treatment facility for young adults, age 18-25, in their son's memory. *Date TBA.*

Vestry Highlights

Highlights from the Vestry meeting on June 24, 2025

- Approved the consent agenda and minutes from the May 27th and June 8th meetings. The June 8th meeting **approved replacing and expanding the playground equipment** at the north end of Lewis Hall using monies from

the General Memorial Fund.

- **Reviewed and approved the May financial statements.** Expenses are under budget and Income is over budget for a positive outlook at this point in the year.
- The Wardens, using feedback from the vestry, **completed a performance**

review for Fr. Paul and will provide a detailed report at the next meeting.

- Junior Warden **Marty Gillen reported that the Buildings and Grounds Committee is beginning their work assessing the current condition of our physical plant**, identifying high-priority needs, and developing a long-term

asset management program.

- **Reviewed our wedding fees.** Most of our weddings are for non-members. We will charge \$2,500, which is comparable to other churches in the diocese similar to our size. Members of St. Andrew's will be extended a substantial discount.



Music Notes

- **Discussed the use of the clergy discretionary fund.** This fund is to be used for helping people in need. As a practical matter, Fr. Paul is not able to adequately screen individual requests. He is exploring partnering with community agencies.

Highlights from the Vestry meeting on August 26, 2025

- **Approved the consent agenda and the minutes** from the June 24 meeting.
- **Reviewed and accepted the July financial statements.** Thanks to the generosity of our members and careful expense management, we are running a small surplus instead of the projected deficit through July.
- **Wardens Kay Wade and Marty Gillen reported on the performance review with Fr. Paul.** Vestry and rector are largely aligned in their assessment and have set goals for the year ahead. Reviews will continue annually in June.
- **Fr. Paul has begun “annual conversations” with staff members** this summer and will report back when these are completed.
- **Discussed preliminary plans for the 200th anniversary** in 2027.
- **Discussed staff benefits policies,** diocesan requirements, and the need to balance competitive compensation with a sustainable operating budget.
- **Approved the Gift Acceptance Committee’s recommendation** for the use of a \$345,000 bequest from the estate of James Crooks: \$25,000 will go to the Unrestricted Operating Fund, with the remainder directed to the General Endowment Fund.
- The Vestry will **host a table at the Ministry Fair** on September 14.

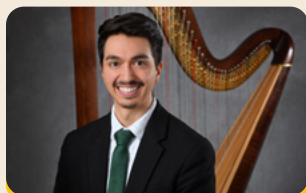

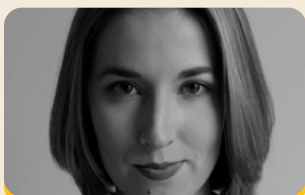
